# **Submission of Papers**

Submission of a paper to this journal implies it reports original and unpublished work and if is accepted the paper will not be published else where in the same form. All contributions will be in English language.

### **Types of Contributions**

Papers reporting results of original research, review articles, short communications and book reviews.

#### Manuscripts handling

Submit the original and two complete copies of each manuscript, including figures and tables. For each manuscript, provide and separate cover (if page giving the following information: 1. Title; 2. Author(s); 3. Postal Address of each author (if different); 4. Short tile (for page heading); 5. Key words; 6. Number of text pages; 7. Name of corresponding author to whom to galley proof and reprints are to be sent; 8. Special instructions to printer, such as magnification of photographs, layout of figures, etc.

# Type of presentation

Type of manuscripts in double space on one side of a good quality A4 paper. All margins should be divided into sections as follows: Title of the paper followed by Author(s) names and affiliation(s), Abstract, Introduction, Materials and Method, Result Discussion, (or Result and Discussion) and Conclusion.

# Acknowledgements and References:

- Title: Type title in lower case, left justified. Do not underline
- Authors: Type names of author(s) in capitals, left justified;
- Authors affiliation(s) in lower case, left justified
- Headings: Use lower case headings in dividing and subdividing the paper;
- Level 1 heading (section): Left justified not underline;
- Level 2 heading (section); left justified, not underline;
- Level 3 headings (sub-sub-sections): in paragraph, underline.

# Figures, tables and plates

Figures, plates and tables should be added separately i.e. not inserted in the typed text. Captions to figures and plates should be collected into one or more separate pages.

- **Figures** including all lettering should be drawn in black ink, preferably on drawing paper. Good quality computer drawn figures may be accepted. Figures/diagrams should be drawn on such a scale that they can be reduced to a width in of 75 mm (one column) or if necessary to a width of 160 mm (two columns) without losing resolution. All lettering on figures should be in lower case. Legends should be inserted in the figure where possible.
- Tables must be printed in a small letter type and should be provided with descriptive headings. All column (75 mm) or two columns (160 mm). All column headings should be typed left justified over that part of the table they are covering, which is indicated by line.
- Plates (photographs) may be included if they provide additional information. When the plates are to be composed from a number of different photographs, the labour of the plates should be carried out by the author(s). Colour plates will not be accepted except under very special circumstances. Position of tables, figures and plates should be indicated in the left margin.

### Units

Only SI units should be used.

#### References

References to literature in the text should be made by mentioning author and year. In the case of two authors, both should be mentioned, by with three or more, only the name of the first author plus et al. should be given. Do not use in list or text. Unpublished results articles in preparation. "In press" or submitted manuscripts' 'references should only be mentioned in the text but copies of these papers should be enclosed for reference by reviewers.

N.B. Authors should check for plagiarism (using TURNITIN) and our maximum similarity index excluding bibliography is 30%
